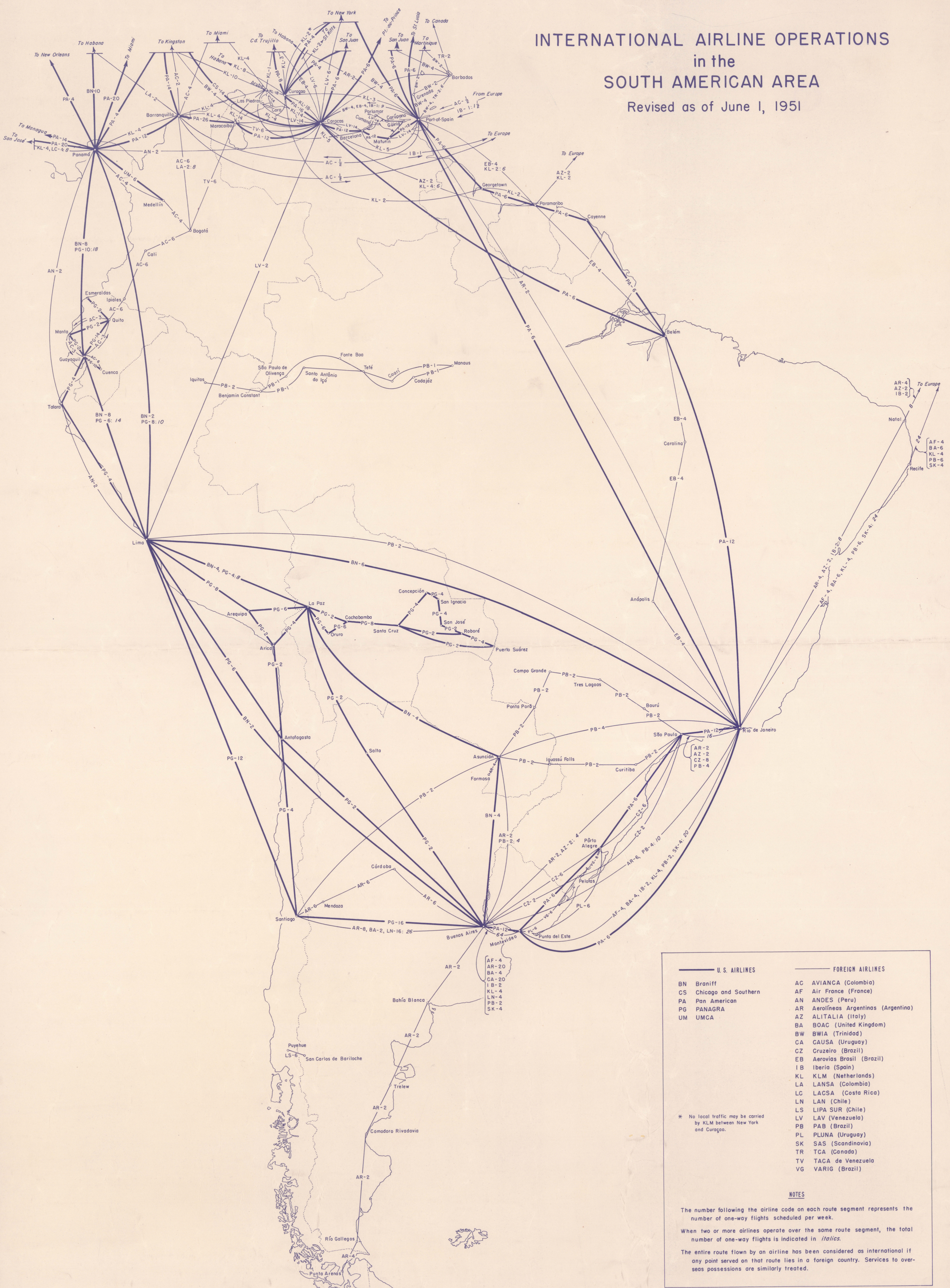

NOTES
